Grade Level News



Kindergarten

Greetings! In Math, we will be learning about measurement and time. In Science, we will be creating a class project to learn how to apply the scientific method. In Reading, we will be learning about the digraph sounds: sh-, ch-, & th-. We will be reading about problem solving and how new ideas can help us sort alike and different information.

1st grade

This month in Literacy we will continue with Unit 5 "How can we make sense of the world around us?" We will now start unit 6, "How does teamwork help us?". We will focus on complex text and determine how the author provides us with information or develops the character, setting, or plot. In Math we are focusing on two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional shapes- looking at their attributes (vertices, sides, flat, closed/open etc.). In Science we are learning about the major parts of a plant.

2nd grade

Greetings from the second grade. As we move into the last month of the school year we are still working hard in both math and reading. In reading, we are continuing with Unit 5 and moving into Unit 6. During Unit 6 we will be working with books about the Earth and what keeps our world working. In math, we will be finishing up our unit on geometry and fractions. We will then move into a review of the second grade curriculum and a preview of third grade. Keep reading at home each night and practicing those spelling words.

3rd grade

Happy May! We can't believe how quickly this year has flown by. We have really had a great year. We are continuing with Author's Point of View in reading and reviewing all old standards in Math. We have three field trips in May so be looking for that paperwork. We will be in need of snacks and cleaning supplies for the last days of school. Thanks for an amazing year! The third grade team.

4th grade

We cannot believe it is May already! Thank you so much for working with us this year to make it the best year yet. This month in reading we will be starting unit 6 in reading wonders. In math, for the remainder of the year, the 4th grade students are taking all the standards they have learned throughout the year and putting them into action! They are completing math tasks that involve problem solving and various math concepts. In Science we will continue our unit on Interdependence then move on to the digestion and body systems. Science projects are due to us no later than May 8th. We also have a field trip May 12th. Have an amazing May!

5th grade

Fifth grade math is focused on preparation for middle school. We are looking forward to these last weeks to polish our skills. We are striving to move forward and upward. We have been reviewing and will be taking the FSA Science on the 3rd and 4th of this month.
